Leg Clubs are an evidence-based initiative providing communitytreatment. health based education promotion, ongoing care for people in all age groups who are experiencing legrelated problems. Leg Club staff work in a unique partnership with patients (members) and the local community. Working to best-practice guidelines they provide a high standard of care in a social, friendly setting that promotes understanding, peer support and informed choice.

On February 6th 2014 the Bradford on Avon Leg Club opened its doors for the first time at Wiltshire Heights Care Home. Initially staff were treating around 15-20 patients (members per week). It soon became clear that the popularity of the Club meant that new premises were needed.

The GP Surgery and the local Council have worked together to identify St Margaret's Hall as a suitable venue which meets the exacting standards of The Leg Club Foundation in respect of infection control and health & safety requirements.

Bradford on Avon Leg Club meets once a week, usually on a Tuesday in St Margaret's Hall. No appointments are required and members can drop in to chat over a cup of tea or coffee whilst awaiting treatment. Transport can be arranged to and from the club, and parking is close by.

If you are registered at the Club you are automatically a member. Our excellent volunteers are also members.

There are no charges and membership is free. The Club is available to any adult registered with Bradford on Avon & Melksham Health Partnership.

Since moving to St Margaret's Hall the membership has grown to over 120 members with around 45-50 patients being treated each Tuesday morning.



We are very grateful to our wonderful volunteers for the refreshments and making our members so welcome. Thank you to Trish, Rachel and Anna.



St Margaret's Hall is a lovely space and we hope to add new services in the autumn, such as Podiatry and NHS Health Checks for Older People.



The Leg Club is a Charity and although the nurses and dressings are funded by the NHS, funds are needed for specialist equipment, leaflets, refreshments, posters, raffle prizes and other social events.
